Subject: Dog Fouling Parkers Close

Unfortunately I am having to raise this matter requesting help in getting this stopped.

There is now regular fouling on the grass and path along Parkers Close mainly by I suspect two dog owners, one with a large dog who is always on his phone paying scant regard for what his dog is doing behind him !

The other is two men walking two large dogs who have been seen allowing their dogs to squat and defecate outside with no attempt to clean it up. This is right near the bus stop and park where children and Catfield residents walk regularly.

Can there not be signs put up at each end advising the legal element of this crime? Or is it possible to get the dog warden to observe this area from time to time?

I am fed up having to get a spade to clean it up.

Your health

Dog mess is not only unpleasant but it is also potentially harmful. In health terms, it can contain a parasitic worm called Toxocara.

Toxocariasis can take an ocular form which means that the worm larva becomes trapped in the eye which can cause visual impairment and possible blindness. It is thought that young children are at a higher risk of developing Toxocariasis, as they are more likely to come into contact with soil or sand that contains dog mess.

Your wallet

We know that the majority of dog owners are responsible and do clean up after their pets, however, there are those who choose not to. It is an offence not to clean up after your dog and in any public area in North Norfolk and includes out-of-the-way beauty spots that are popular with lots of people, not just dog walkers.

If you don't clear up after your dog you are liable for a £80 fixed penalty notice (£60 if paid within 10 days). If you don't pay the fixed penalty, action in magistrates' courts could result in a fine of up to £1000, on conviction.

Tell us about a dog owner failing to clean up after their dog.

If you want to report an instance of dog fouling please make a note of the following information if possible:

date and time the fouling took place, or when you discovered it

location of the incident

description of the dog and owner

If you have any additional information such as the name or address of the dog owner concerned, please include this on the form.

Farming News

Towards the end of July the weather turned, it stopped raining and combining began. Winter barley (for beer) was cut and the Sustainable Farming Options drilled. This is all about providing public goods for public money. So, I hope you like it. What I have noticed is people like it so much that they walk all over it, with friends and/or their dogs. Sorry, you are not permitted to do this, so please stop. I watched four lads a couple of days ago walking across it and as soon as they noticed that they were being watched they hid up in the maize, until I saw them a few minutes later looking out of the maize to see if the coast was clear. Spring barley is harvested and we await the last few lorries to take it to the store. This is destined for Guinness. The game bird covers after spring barley have been drilled. Wheat should be ready in a day or so and then the winter sheep food can be drilled. That just leaves Spring Beans. There is an electric fence up to stop the deer getting to the field but I think they've learnt to jump it. There is only one thing left to do now and that's with a rifle.

Cereal stubbles, where required, have all been cultivated to encourage dross barley to chit before we plant the next crop. This prevents contamination of the next crop.

Sugar beet, Maize and Potatoes are suffering badly in the hot dry weather. Luckily, I've finished pulling wild oats and weed beet and can retreat to colder parts of my farm or the office. Water tanks and bowls for stock and dogs have to be checked every day, sometimes twice a day. The sheep have plenty of cover from trees in their summer quarters and are mostly found sound asleep in the shade. The rams should be reunited with the ewes in about 3 weeks to ensure lambing starts in mid-February.

Tractor and combine registrations seem to be declining. SFI appears to be the reason as, once established, you only need a topper to top the weeds. It is a bit concerning that if the Government ever thinks food security is at threat, we don't appear to have the kit in the Country to farm all the land, so it looks like we'll be watching weeds grow for some time to come.

Contracts for 2025 are mostly down. Sugar beet by some 18%. So, the question farmers should be asking is should I carry on with Sugar beet or swap into SFI? In Catfield where yields are good, grow both, Sugar beet and SFI. Potato rents are low when compared to SFI returns and SFI does not damage the soil structure or require irrigation. Because we have a long period between cereal harvest and planting Spring crops, there is the opportunity to do SFI in the Winter with cover crops. Agents soon realised that SFI was a more profitable form of "farming" than renting the land to a "farmer", however RPA responded by limiting field area of SFI to 25% and asking difficult questions about where has the tenant gone? The decrease of BPS to virtually nothing has got landowners worried and odd bits of land are being put on the market. There appears to be resistance to buying land from farmers probably because there is not the return in it that there used to be and no BPS to prop up farming income. All the financial risk is on the farmer and generally we farmers don't like taking risks.

Hedges and brambles have grown hugely this year. One hedge that was only planted 4 years ago is now 10 ft tall and obscuring the neighbour's breeze block wall, which was the aim. I pulled out some brambles in a garden last week which were 20ft long. Hedge row fruit is excellent, especially the plums at Holly Farm, even my labrador likes them and he's more of a meat and biscuit connoisseur.

We are getting the first indications as to whether regenerative farming is hitting the mark. Are the yields there? What's the crop quality like? What's the add mix like? (that's anything that is not the commodity you are selling). I made my mind up when I took my very nice samples of barley to the store, the storeman was struggling to unload a load of "something" but all the add mix was preventing the lorry's contents from unloading. So regenerative farming does work but you need an advanced processing system on the farm to save your embarrassment at the store and protect you from crop rejections. I'm going to stick to conventional farming, managed inputs and high outputs producing what the market place wants. And a bit of SFI.

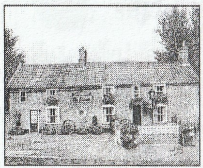

Monthly events programme

We have also added some new members this past few months but we are still keen to make new friends, please contact the Secretary via the website if you are interested in what we do. We are based in Catfield.

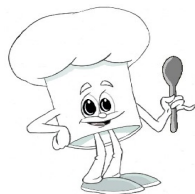

Chef's Specials



Lemon Poppy Seed Cheesecake With Berry Puree

Ingredients

2 lemons
300g cottage cheese
300g cream cheese
250ml soured cream
200g caster sugar
3 tbsp cornflour
4 eggs
1 ½ tbsp poppy seeds
Icing sugar, for dusting
Strawberries and raspberries, to decorate

For the puree

250g fresh frozen or preserved berries
85g caster sugar

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 150C. Grease and line a 23cm springform cake tin. Grate the zest from the lemons and squeeze the juice. Place the cheeses, soured cream, sugar, cornflour, lemon zest and two-thirds of the lemon juice into a food processor and process until smooth.
2. Add the eggs and process to combine. Stir in the poppy seeds, pour the mixture into the prepared tin (the mixture should fill half to two-thirds of the tin, and bake for 1 hour 30 minutes or until the cake is firm.
3. Meanwhile, to make the berry puree, place the berries, sugar and remaining lemon juice in a food processor and blend until smooth. Chill, covered, until needed.
4. When the cake is done, remove from the oven and run a knife around the edge of the tin to loosen the cake and stop the surface cracking when cooling. Let it cool in the tin on a wire rack then chill for at least 5 hours. When ready to serve, remove from the tin, dust with icing sugar and serve with the fresh fruit and the berry puree.

NWT Hickling Broad and Marshes.

As we enter early-autumn many of our wild flowers are a spent force in terms of colour as they set seed to prepare for the continuance of the species into the following year. The exception to this is Hemp Agrimony. It is the most abundant flowering plant on the NWT reserve at this time of year, lining the paths and waterways with tall stands of green plants with groups of fingered leaves, all topped with a platter of pastel pink flowers forming a series of umbrellas of colour at the extremities of the stems. Platters are what they are as they are extremely valuable late nectar sources to a myriad of invertebrate species. Stop awhile on your visit and inspect these flower-heads; you will surely be amazed at the variety of insect life that visits them.

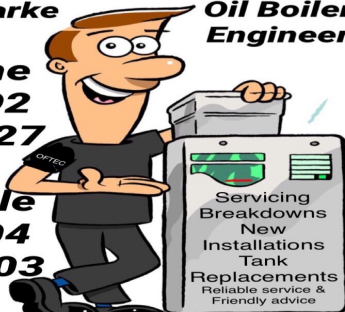

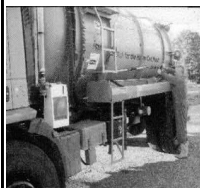
